Proceeding of the Miner's meeting held in Tiger Mining District Feb. 4th, 1871

Meeting called to order and Jackson Mc Cracken elected temporary President moved and seconded that E. A. Gordon be elected Secretary. Motion, that the president appoint three to draft rules and regulations for the government of the district carried. Mr. Rus Rodgers and Gordon were duly appointed on report of the committee.

The following rules and regulations were adopted.

ARTICLE 1st.

That the district is to be known as the "Tiger" District.

ARTICLE 2nd.

This district shall include all the country draining into a stream known as the "Humbug" from its head to a joint ten miles down said stream.

ARTICLE 3rd.

The officers of the District shall consist of one recorder who shall be elected, by the Miners of the district for the term of one year unless sooner removed by charges properly performed and sustained, by claim holders of the district.

ARTICLE 4th.

It shall be the duty of the recorder when so ordered by five claim holders to call and preside over all meetings and business pertaining to the district.

ARTICLE 5th.

The duties of the recorder shall be to record all claims or articles pertaining to the rights of the Miners. also to act as Secretary of all meetings keeping a correct record of the proceedings of the same.

ARTICLE 6th.

All locations made in this district shall be designated, by a monument and notice thereon, to be placed on some prominent part of the location describing location and direction of the lode, and of amount of ground claimed, not to exceed 200 feet for each claimant, with the right of an additional 200 feet for the discovery claim.

ARTICLE 7th.

It shall be the duty of every location to file. A copy of his notice within ten days from date of location with this winning recorder of the district.

ARTICLE 8th.

Resolved that five days work to every claim, shall hold the same for the period of six month, the work to commence within thirty day from date of record.

ARTICLE 9th.

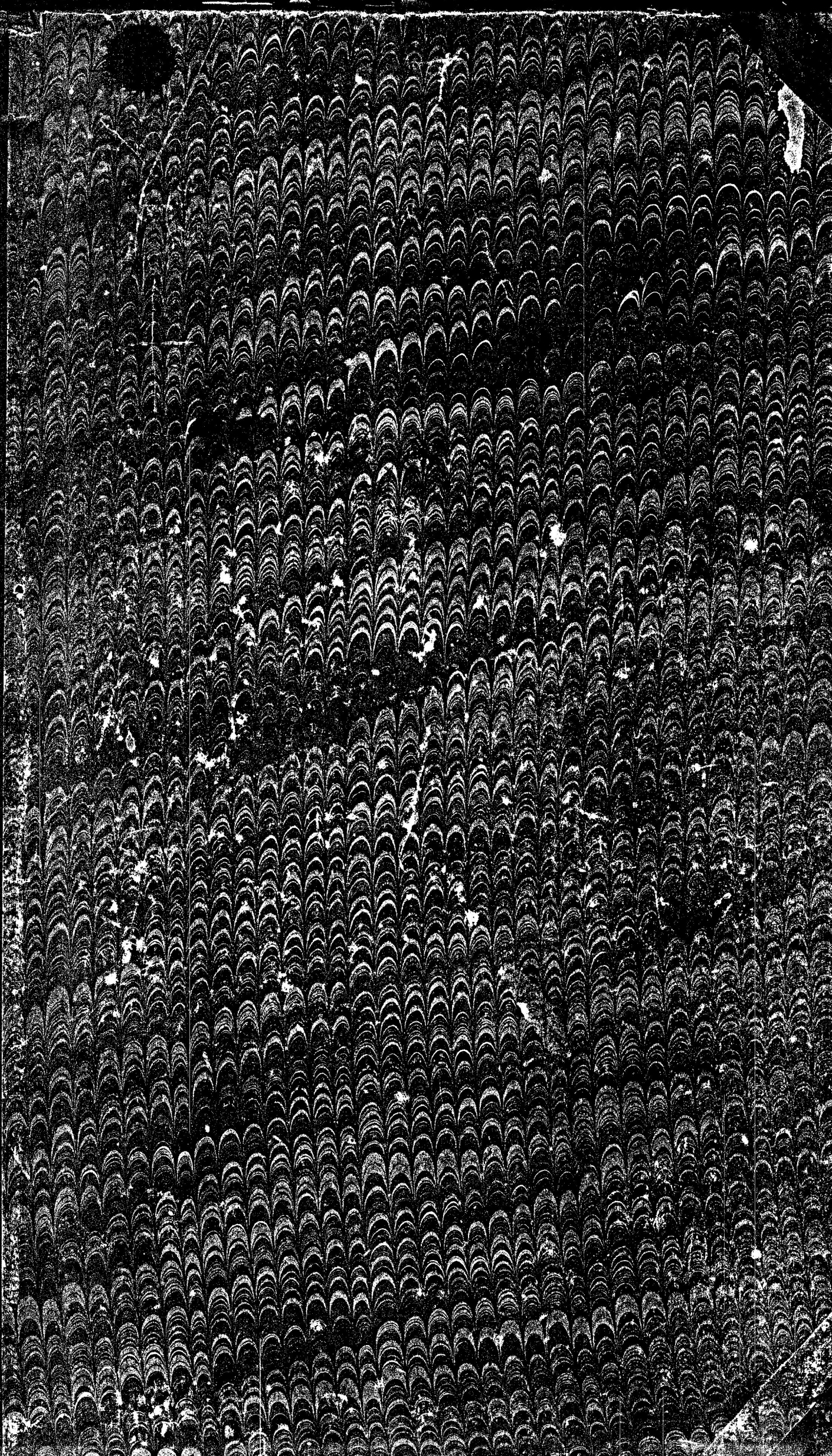
The recorder shall be allowed one dollar for such as fees for recording.

Keeping a correct record of the proceedings of the same
Article 6th

All locations made in this District shall be designated, by a Monument and Notice thereon, to be placed on some prominent part of the location describing location and direction of the lode, and of the amount of ground claimed, not to exceed 200 feet for each claimant, with the right of an additional 200 feet for the Discovery claim

" 7th

It shall be the duty of every locator to file a copy of his Notice, within ten days from date of location with the Mining Recorder, of the District

" 8th

Resolved that five days work to every claim, shall hold the same for the period of six months, the work to commence within thirty days from date of Record

" 9th

The Recorder shall be allowed one dollar, in name as Fee for recording.

On motion of Mr. J. Rees E. A. Gordon was duly elected Recorder for the period of one year
